Ensembles then perform on a ticketed daytime or evening concert receiving additional comments on their performance from the faculty. When not on stage, ensembles have the opportunity to attend performances by other participating bands and orchestras from seats in the audience.

VENUE

Performance at New York City's legendary Carnegie Hall, Isaac Stern Auditorium.

EXPERIENCE

Qualified bands and orchestras receive 22 minutes of solo stage time receiving comments from our faculty, attend performances of other participating ensembles, a private clinic session in host hotel ballroom, and ensemble listing on official concert poster.

CONCERT STAFF

Professional production team handles venue management, advertising, and audience development.

PERCUSSION

Over \$2,000 of rented equipment including: timpani (4 sizes), concert bass drum, concert snare drum, concert chimes, bells, xylophone, vibraphone, marimba, and crash cymbal.

Chung Park teaches at St. Olaf College, leading the St. Olaf and Philharmonia Orchestras and teaching courses in conducting. He has also led orchestra programs at the University of Central Florida, Appalachian State University, Idaho State University and the University of North Dakota. Dr. Park regularly leads clinics and honor orchestras nationwide, with recent and future engagements in California, Kansas, Florida, New York, Tennessee and Pennsylvania. Bärenreiter-verlag has recently published his edition of J.S. Bach's Cello Suites in a transcription for viola, the first such edition for the preeminent international publisher. Park earned his doctorate in instrumental conducting from the University of Miami, and holds M.M. degrees in orchestral conducting (University of Illinois) and viola performance (Western Michigan University), and a B.M. in viola performance from the Peabody Conservatory of Music.

Dr. Sarah McKoin serves as the Director of Bands, Professor of Music and Chair of the conducting area at Texas Tech University. Her responsibilities include Conductor and Musical Director of the TTU Symphonic Wind Ensemble, administrating the graduate program in wind conducting, pedagogy and wind literature, while overseeing all facets of the university band program which include 5 concert bands, the 400-member Goin' Band and other athletic bands. Under Dr. McKoin's direction, the Symphonic Wind Ensemble has been featured at the Midwest Clinic, the Texas Music Educators Association Conference, the North American Saxophone Alliance conference and multiple College Band Directors National Association Southwest regional conferences.
